On November 11, 2006, Veterans' Day, the Village of Farnham dedicated their new monument to the Veterans of Farnham which is located at the entrance to the Village's new playground and park.

"A few years ago, when the village was in the planning stages for our new park, I asked several residents to be on the planning committee. One of these members, Mr. Ray Dunkel, noted that the village had no area dedicated to honor the men and women of the Village of Farnham who had served in the military. As a Vietnam Era Veteran, I certainly understood and appreciated the importance of those who have contributed military service to our great nation. And so, Mr. Dunkel became the driving force behind this vision and the design of our memorial stone which we will unveil today, and which is only the beginning stage of a Veteran's Memorial Area for our park," noted Farnham Mayor Terry Caber at the dedication ceremony. "I thank Mr. Dunkel not only for his exemplary military service, but also for his vision to honor the men and women of the village of Farnham for their service as well.

During Farnham's 114 year history, there have been many men and women who have served during both times of war and times of peace. The Farnham Centennial Book mentions 6 individuals who lost their lives during World War II; they are: Edward Schrader, Michael Graci, Samuel Battaglia, Raymond Koch, Edward Stuerhing and Howard Nordblum.

Other Individuals who have served in the military include: Ray Dunkel, Paul Lapiana, Maggie White, Russell Battaglia, Charles Lapiana, Gayle Holmes, Albert Battaglia, Frank Militello, William Battaglia, Christian Militello Sr., Charles Wasmund, Ken Ditcher, Roy Wasmund, Nicholas Sprat, Bill Russell, William Graci, Bob Russell, Gary Schwartz, Richard Hoisington, Cliff Schwartz, David Pruett, Joseph Lapiana and Valentine Krtanjek; Iraq Veterans Kevin Fricano, Nicholas Orlando, Rob Browning, Tom VanWie and Peter Muscarella. 

Lincoln Funeral Train Pictorial Postmarks Highlighted the 150th Anniversary

Brant Historian Patty Friend and the Brant-Farnham Historical Society initiated an event with the US Post Office based on Lincoln's Funeral Train and its journey from Buffalo to Ripley, NY.

Twelve Pictorial Cancellations were designed for all stops listed on the Buffalo and Erie Rail Road Time Table (right), from Buffalo to Ripley, as well as four extra Post Offices along the route - Athol Springs, Lakeview, Derby and Sheridan. Christian J. LoGrasso, native of Angola, NY, designed 15 of the 16 "stops". Rosalee "Tish" Hill, life-long resident of Brant, designed the pictorial Postmark for Farnham, NY.

Postmaster of Angola, Brant and Farnham for his constant support of our Historical Postmark Projects!

Vince Martonis, Hanover Historian, was diligent in contacting the USPS, requesting a special authorization letter. We were able to distribute this letter to school districts along Lincoln's Funeral Train Route. Children from the Dunkirk, NY Schools (Kimberlee Texter, School #4 Principal) visited the Dunkirk Post office, and children from the John T. Waugh School (Paula Eastman, Principal) in Angola visited the Angola Post Office to collect their Pictorial Cancels. Approximately 120 children in all visited! Kimberly Buchanan (Westfield Postmaster) plotted the origins of all requests received on a map. She had requests from Spain, Germany, Nederland and all over the U.S.A. from California to Oregon, and Florida to Maine. David Tempestoso, Postmaster of Angola, said he has never seen such a line of people at the post office as there was on June 30th! And Wally Samick of the Farnham Post Office said he is having a blast processing the cancels!

150th Anniversary Lincoln Funeral Train Route Pictorial Postmark Cancels officially ended October 28, 2015. The Fall 2015 issue of *WNY Heritage Magazine* included a Letter to the Editor from The Town of Brant Historian. The final Pictorial Postmark totals for each location as provided by Cynthia Weigel of United States Postal Service Pictorial Postmark Office in Kansas City, Mo. are as follows:






The Buffalo and Erie County Public Library, along with the Buffalo Post Office, hosted a

Temporary Postal Station at the Library. The June 30th, 2015 event featured the Buffalo, NY 150th Anniversary of Lincoln's Funeral Train Route postmark and special Lincoln envelope, both designed by Christian J. LoGrasso, to recognize Lincoln's last journey through our state. The Library may have some of the cancelled envelopes for sale - check the Library's website for more information. It was a news worthy event of which Christian received much deserved recognition for his time and talent.







"The Funeral Train traveled slowly towards the countryside and into the southern portion of Erie County, passing through Hamburg, North Evans, Lakeview, 18 Mile Creek, Derby, Evans Center, Angola, FARNHAM, and Irving. The Buffalo and Erie Railroad was now in charge of the trip to Erie Pennsylvania." ... All employees of the railroad company had received:

"Buffalo, April 24 '65 To all operators: B. & E. R.R.:

On Thursday next, the day on which the funeral train of our late President moves over this road, you will be on hand promptly and in your offices at all hours of the day and night until after the train has passed your station, not leaving your offices without permission from headquarters. Any neglect of duty however great or small will be followed by immediate dismissal."

She told us that there were 96 requests for the Lincoln Pictorial Cancel that arrived two weeks prior to the 6/30/2015 cancel date, including two from Hawaii and 30 from Texas. On June 30th, there were 15 walk in's with 49 envelopes requesting the Lincoln cancel.
- 5. WESTFIELD, NY: Scott had stacks of mail for the Lincoln cancel -150 FIRST DAY requests!





• Christian LoGrasso, Lydall, CT: Donation of photo of the Frank and Orazio Lo-Grasso Families on what we believe to be Ellis Road. [Via email.] Christian wrote: "Regarding the photo, there is one person I can definitely identify and two that I have a good sense of who they are. The oldest woman who is seated on the left is Angela LoGrasso, wife of Orazio LoGrasso, who was the oldest LoGrasso female to live in Brant/Angola. She's the one that is buried in the cemetery in Buffalo. That would be my Grandfather Horace's Grandmother.



The one on the bike I believe is my Great Grandfather, Fred LoGrasso, who ultimately owned the Macaroni factory '[in Angola]. I believe the woman next to the oldest woman is his wife at the time, Saverina (Sarah) LoGrasso. I think this photo was taken between 1916 and 1926. I am not sure of the others in the photo, it is possible they are neighbors or helpers of some kind."



Jeanne Treat: Donation of a box of approx. (25) or more B&W photos, reprinted from glass negatives of Lynn E. Walters. A large number of the photos are of Camp Hughes, Farnham. Town of Brant Erie County Halley Road T.H. 350 Width - 4 Rods

Description as copied from Page 77, Road Record Book 1, Town of Eden, as follows:

"Traverse of a road beginning on the west line of Lot No. 1 in the 8th T. 9R, and running thence E on the division line between Henry Holaday and William Bennet 25 chains to a stake Thense S 57degrees E 8 chains to a stake. Thense S 71degrees E 11.50 chains to the line of Concord.

Width one chain Eden Oct. 8, 1819 Stephen White, Surveyor
